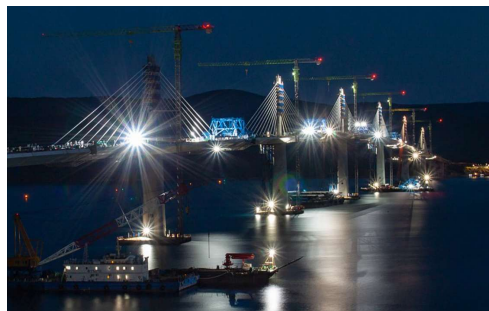


## THE GREAT BRIDGE – PELJASAC BRIDGE

### HOW TO MAKE BEST USE OF NEW BRIDGE CONNECTION

From June 2022 on you will not need to pass Neum and cross the border to reach Dubrovnik from the direction of Neum. The new bridge will connect Croatian mainland with Peljasac peninsula and make the trip much faster and smoother. But even more importantly, it will make Peljasac peninsula and Korcula much more accessible. From June 2022 on a stop in Neum will be a choice and not a necessity anymore!



## PELJASAC PENNINSULA

Peljasac peninsula is food lover's paradise. Here you will find Ston, famous for oysters and salt and for Croatia's most praised wine, Plavac mali, a velvety red wine indigenous to this area.

What to do in Peljasac?

### STON

Ston is already often visited by groups, because it has a lot to offer. In Ston you can climb Europe's longest walls, visit the salt pans, enjoy oyster tasting or oyster meal and you can even take a boat trip to oyster farm, where you will see first hand how oysters are being picked.



### WINE TASTING

Peljasac is a popular choice for wine tasting. And wine tasting here is very interesting – most of the wineries in this area are smaller, family managed wineries so the experience can be rather unique, completely different from large volume producers that guests might have visited in France or Spain.



## KORCULA ISLAND

Korcula island will become much more accessible. From Orebic in Peljasac it is just a short boat ride to Korcula town, which is one of the most beautiful, traditional and well preserved old town on the whole Adriatic coastline. Allegedly Korcula town is also a birthplace of Marco Polo and you can visit his birth house. To visit Korcula town you need less then half a day from Orebic, but you can also spend overnight in Korcula and visit other parts of the island.



## MLJET NATIONAL PARK

Another destination that will be much easier to reach is Mljet National Park. Mljet National park is an archipelago located off the coast of Peljasac. You can make a boat trip from Peljasac and visit this beautiful National Park, which is covered in dense green colour. The most fascinating part are Mljet lakes with a scenic Monastery of Saint Mary, located on a tiny island.
